

# STAY HOME - SAVE LIVES

If you are unwell (even if you don't think it is COVID-19);

If you have a temperature, a new continuous cough, or a change to your sense of smell or taste;

If you have been advised to self-isolate because of recent foreign travel, test and trace, a positive COVID test, or any other reason.



## BEFORE YOU COME TO CHURCH

### BOOKING

You'll need to book your place each week.

Booking opens after church on Sunday for the following week.

Booking closes at lunchtime on Friday.

Operating a booking system helps us to maximise our capacity while maintaining social-distancing.

If you don't book, we may not have space for you on Sunday.

We will leave space for unexpected visitors.

You should book your whole household or bubble at the same time.

### BUBBLES

You can attend church as a 'bubble' with another household:

- ⇒ If you are a single adult living alone, or a single parent whose children are under 18, you can form a support bubble with one other household
- ⇒ The second household can be of any size, and can include people who are shielding
- ⇒ You should only form a bubble with one other household. For example, you can't have a bubble for church and another bubble for family.
- ⇒ If you choose to form a bubble, you can travel to church together and sit together as if you are the same household.
- ⇒ If you choose to form a bubble, please fill in the booking form together, not separately.

### FACE MASKS

Face masks are mandatory while you are inside the church building.

The face mask must cover your mouth and nose, and fit securely around the side of the face.

There are a few exceptions to this:

- Children under 11
- People who cannot wear a mask because of a physical/mental illness, or impairment or disability
- Where wearing a face mask will cause you severe distress
- Those leading services, or assisting the leading of a service by doing a Bible reading, prayers etc.

Disposable face masks will be available at the entrance.

If you have an exemption from wearing a face mask, it would be helpful to let Anne know beforehand, so the stewards can be made aware.

# WHEN YOU GET TO CHURCH

## BEFORE THE SERVICE

When you arrive, wait in your car until a steward indicates that you can enter the church.

A steward will tell you where you are sitting.

There is a one-way system in the church. Enter through the road-side doors, and exit through the canal-side door.

In the church hall, you can enter and exit through the main doors.

## KITCHEN

Please only enter the kitchen if essential.

## AFTER THE SERVICE

At the end of the service, we will leave one row at a time as directed by the service leader.

Please leave the church building and car park promptly.

## DURING THE SERVICE

Please keep a distance of 2 metres from all other households while at church, including in the car park.

Please keep your children with you at all times.

Please keep your face-mask on during the service.

Please stay in your seat during the service, unless you need to use the toilets.

Please refrain from singing during the songs. You might like to hum to help you engage with the worship.

There will be Bibles at church, but please bring your own if possible. If you use a church Bible, please only use the one that is directly in front of you in the pew.

## TOILETS

Men - please use the upstairs toilet

Women - please use the downstairs toilets

This helps us not to have overlapping queues.
